A Word From Pastor Carl

DISTRICT DISCOURSE

Pastor Carl

When I go away for meetings, sometimes folks ask me about the details of these events. In the middle of July, I rode with the pastor of Sychar Lutheran in Silver Bay to St. Charles, Illinois. Mark Vander Tuig, the service coordinator of LCMC (whose role is like a president) called a meeting of the leaders of the districts and fellowship groups to directly inquire about the real needs of our congregations.

The districts of LCMC are organized to be a smaller network for congregations to provide opportunities for fellowship, learning, and mission opportunities. A district is a smaller unit of congregations that is either regional or national and instead, focused on a specific ministry or theological emphasis. Districts interview potential pastors to ensure their qualifications to be rostered as pastors. Furthermore, districts also attempt to help with finding substitutes for congregations when their pastor needs to be gone and provide front-line support when congregational conflict ensues before the national board or staff can offer assistance.

There are a number of regional districts in LCMC including: Greater Twin Cities, Intermountain West, Pacific NW, Southern California, North East, Florida, Heartland, Iowa, and Texas. There are also four districts that are non-territorial including: Augustana, Cross Alone, Evangelical-District, and the Epiphany District.

Beyond the organization of districts, there are also less-structured networks that are not as formal in their organization. These smaller entities are called "fellowship groups." Our local chapter is called the Lake Superior Fellowship Group. Our regional connection numbers a dozen congregations. Therefore we do not need a deeper level of structure that the districts require. While we are leaner in our organization, the pastors still meet together every other month for study and encouragement. Lake Superior fellowship group hosts a fall theological gathering and a spring leadership training event. The fall theological gathering in Duluth on Saturday, October 26 will examine the specifics about what the Bible has to say about the afterlife.

We thank God as things continue to come into shape as we mature into more fully being the body of Christ and carrying out his ministry.
