ADVENTS

very year our country needs to be reminded of the true meaning of Christmas. As the adage says, "Jesus is the Reason for the Season." The most obvious difference between the Christian and secular celebrations is whether we give more honor to Jesus Christ or to Santa and the reindeer. Besides such an obvious dissimilarity between the sacred and secular Christmas, another distinctive of the Christian celebration versus the worldly is that the real Christmas is preceded by Advent. In some smaller ways, a secular Advent has also developed. I remember trying to purchase an advent calendar in a store once and none of them had a picture of the Holy Family on them. Instead there were Barbie and Dora the Explorer Advent calendars. But overall, Advent primarily is still a religious season and has not overly been mixed with secular festivities. I have yet to hear "Rocking Around the Advent Wreath.' The major theme of Advent is preparing for the birth of Christ as the baby boy born in Bethlehem. This has always been and continues to be its central focus.

Word From Pastor Carl (Continued From Page 1) **ADVENTS**

Some of the hymns clearly think on the coming of Christ in Bethlehem in such well-known songs such as, "O Come, O Come, Immanuel." But a good number of the other hymns in the Advent section of the hymnal do not focus specifically on Christ's original arrival but instead have a broader focus on Christ coming to us in other ways such as through the proclamation of the Gospel, when Jesus rode on a donkey into Jerusalem and was proclaimed "the Son of David," and how our Lord will come again as the king to judge the living and the dead. For example, one of the typical scripture texts traditionally read in the worship service during Advent is Jesus teaching his disciples about the end of the world. One of the hymns in the Advent section of the hymnal with this focus is "Lo, He Comes with Clouds Descending."

Another example of this wider view of Advent is in the readings containing John the Baptist. When John declared to the people, "Prepare the Way of the Lord," he was not talking about Christ's birth to Mary and Joseph. Instead, John was calling the people to prepare for the adult Christ's preaching ministry. Two Advent hymns in this tradition include, "On Jordan's Banks the Baptist's Cry" and "Comfort, Comfort, Now My People."

Again another traditional Advent theme that is not specifically tied with the nativity is the remembrance on his entry into Jerusalem when he was hailed as a king a week before he was crucified. Some of the Advent hymns with this focus are "Prepare the Royal Highway" and "O Lord, How Shall I Meet You." For the last couple years, we have

not thought on these other themes

of Advent. The cycle of readings that we have followed is called the "Narrative Lectionary" which begins at Genesis in September and works its way through the Bible in one year. We can still later expect to hear about John the Baptist in January. Likewise, we will specifically think about Christ in the second coming at the end of church year.

I find this "beginning to end" way of learning about the life of Christ, and the scriptures in general, easier than having four lessons per Sunday and then jumping around in the Bible. The Narrative Lectionary begins the new cycle each year in September with Genesis. By the beginning of Advent, the church is finishing the study of the Old Testament and how the oracles of the prophets pointed towards the arrival of the Christ child.

While we gain clarity in moving in a straighter trajectory, we do forfeit the reminders that the original Christmas 2000 years ago was not a one-time event. Each time we hear the sweet promises of the Gospel in the sermon, we also encounter the Word preached to us like John the Baptist proclaimed a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And that same Word made flesh, Jesus Christ, will eventually bring his children to someday meet him face-to-face, too, at the end of days. To gain a sense of all the emphases of the Advent season, one can turn to one of the lesser-known Advent hymns, "The Advent of Our God."

Verse 2: (Christ coming in the manger)

The everlasting Son, incarnate stoops to be, Himself the servant's form puts on to set his people free.

Verse 3: (Christ who came to Jerusalem as the king)

Come Zion's daughter rise to meet your lowly king Nor let your faithless heart despise the peace he comes to bring.

Verse 4: (Christ in the second coming)

As judge, on clouds of light, He soon will come again. And all his scattered saints unite with him on high to reign ~~~~~~~

HLCW Meeting Monday, November 25, 2013

A meeting of Hope Lutheran Church Women was held Monday, Nov. 25, 2013 in the Hope dining hall preceding the Bible study session, at 10:00 a.m. Ten members were present. President Grace Autio presided at the meeting. The minutes of the Oct. 23rd meeting were read by the secretary and upon motion by Lois Hendrickson, seconded by Jan Benson were approved as read.

Jeanette Johnsen's treasurer's report showed a checking balance as of Oct. 28, of \$1,892.48. Income included the amount of \$1,099.65 from the bazaar. Expenses during the month totaled \$835.70, making a total current balance in checking of \$2,174.43. It showed that bazaar expenses totaled \$217.41 and a profit was made of \$882.24 plus \$35.00 still to come in. Available funds after certain designated funds are \$678.44. Upon motion by Liz Thom and seconded, all voted aye for the treasurer's report.

Parsonage Paint Project: Dennis Davis will not be able to finish the project by December 1st, as problems apparently came up, but he expects to have the job done soon after that.

Grace reported that she has \$75.00 in cook book money to turn in. She also noted that the new changing table is here but is not yet installed.

It was noted by Jan Benson that we served 98 dinners during the bazaar, including 6 take-outs.

NEW BUSINESS: It was decided to conduct Cookie Can Sunday on December 15th and people are asked to bring four dozen cookies; and be sure to wrap them three or four to a package, cling wrap, snack bag or whatever, so that a variety can be distributed in each cookie can.

GIVING TREE: Jeanette asked if HLCW wished to contribute to this charity again this year, and it was agreed to contribute to the Bethany Crisis Center plus mittens, hats and scarves to the Lighthouse, by December 15th. A motion was made by Lois, seconded by Laverne Hutton, to also donate \$100 to the Crisis Center towards their kitchen updating project besides bringing items for both charities. The vote was all aye, and approved.

A motion by Susan Coccie, seconded by Jan, to contribute to the local Operation Rudolph project, was by vote unanimously approved.

It was decided to meet again for Bible study in December on Monday, the 30th at 10:00 a.m.

It was decided to not have a regular quilting session tomorrow (Tuesday) because it's so close to Thanksgiving.

Susan noted that a community Christmas Day dinner will be held at 12:00 noon at the Fair Building.

Pastor and Jodi's wedding reception will be held downstairs following their wedding on Dec. 28th Volunteers to serve cookies are Liz Thom, Shirley Johnson, Susan Coccie and Grace Autio.

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned at 10:45 a.m.

Committee is deciding on coffee table or end tables. They will decide after the chairs come in. Rae Rosemore is checking on fire safe. Marion will send out email or put in the bulletin for training on copy machine when he gets a date. A clock, mirror and pull down shades are still needed for the office.

Evaluations – Pastor Carl's still needs to be done. We decided to evaluate Pastor at the next council meeting. Dean will come up with the questions.
