Recognizing that there is a common theme but that it is not always obvious right away, Lonna Hutchinson requested that a brief description of each hymn be provided in the bulletin to help draw out what we are really singing. Therefore, I have attempted to provide a little background in the bulletin.

Also addressing the selection of hymns, Lois Hendrickson suggested that it would be enjoyable to request songs for worship including her favorite, the Spanish song "You Have Come Down to the Lakeshore." I agree that it be would be fun to learn what people's old and newer favorites are and hear the congregation sing them out.

For the next couple weeks, the bulletin will include a form to indicate your choices and return them in the offering plates. The worship and music committee will attempt to include your requests for the season. We will likely still connect the "Hymn of the Day", that is the song following the sermon, with the message but the opening and closing songs will likely be selections from the congregation.

This collection of hymns will be a part of our Lenten focus for the year with the "Music of the Exiles." We remember from the Old Testament that Judah, the southern kingdom and its capital, Jerusalem, were conquered by the Babylonians in the year 587 B.C. One can read, in part, about the people's hope for returning home from the book of Isaiah, chapters 40-55. We shall think about their lament and yet how the people still were able to raise their voices. In like manner, we can listen to and sing songs for deliverance and praise in spite of our tribulations.

#### HLCW MEETING JANUARY 13, 2015

The meeting opened at 10:15 a.m. With President Grace Autio presiding. Seven members were present.

The minutes of the Dec.11, 2014 minutes were read by the secretary and upon motion by Susan Coccie, seconded by Jan Benson, were voted approved as read. Jeanette Johnsen's treasurer's report showed an end of year balance of \$583.56 after expenses of \$2,772.23 since the last meeting. The report also showed a savings balance of \$1,434.33. Available funds at this meeting was \$822.33. Upon motion by Elsie Tollgaard, seconded by LaVerne Hutton, the treasurer's report was accepted as presented.

Grace Autio reported that the quilt room is now moved to its new quarters; and we need five more of the clear totes for enough storage to keep items off the floor. Upon motion by Susan, seconded by Nancy to purchase five more totes, the motion was passed as read. Susan said she would be going to Duluth on Thursday and would get the totes at that time.

Representing the church council, Susan reported that Jeff Kletscher wants to know for sure if there is enough commitment by church members to conduct the upcoming April auction, as a lot of people will need to be involved, in the business of the auction and in the kitchen. President Autio said that there are enough women ready to serve the lunch at the Arrowhead Hall; but we also need many people to log everything in, take care of the paper work and also someone needs to be there on grounds overnight to oversee the items parked outside the hall. The bookkeeping is a big job, and Grace noted that we need to know by next month how many people will commit to work.

NEW BUSINESS: Thank you notes for the Christmas cookies we sent from Violet Johnson, Elina Johnson, the Crisis Nursery and the Life House in Duluth, were read. A newsletter from Lutheran Social Services was passed around, and Grace read an update and letter from Judy Yund at Bethel Hospital and Frank Houghton, Amachuma, Bolivia, missions sponsored by our church organization.

There is a committee of women in place to serve brunch at the baby shower on Sunday, the 18<sup>th</sup> for Pastor Carl and Jodi Fiskness at the Fair Building at 11:00 a.m.

The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, Feb. 10 at 10:00 a.m.

The meeting adjourned at 10:40 a.m., followed by the regular Bible study lead by Jeanette Johnsen.

#### *UNAPPROVED* HOPE LUTHERAN CHURCH FLOODWOOD, MN MINUTES OF REGULAR MEETING JANUARY 20, 2015

Meeting called to order at 7:05 pm by President Susan Coccie. Pastor Fiskness opened with prayer.

Present: Pastor Carl Fiskness, Bubba Vance, Marion Shafer, Susan Coccie, David Zieroth, Kathy Johnsen. Absent: Rae Rosemore, Carlene Jatkola, Bryan Hutchinson, Jen Myles, Lonna Hutchinson.

There was not a quorum of the Council tonight, so no motions or decisions were made.

Jeff Kletscher presented the end-of-year financial reports and the Budget Committee report. He stated that he will not continue to oversee the financial aspects of the church after having done so for 7 years, feeling that it is time for a new perspective. Jeff also stated he has heard that the Hepola family may not be donating Arnold Hepola's estate for the April auction and he is concerned that there would not be a sufficient amount of quality items to make the auction worthwhile. Jeff will meet with Lee Samuelson to be clear as to what will be donated to the church auction.

Quilters: Have completed 11 quilts this month.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

**A.** Auction – The Council agreed with Jeff Kletscher that if we don't get a commitment from the Hepola family to donate Arnold Hepola's estate we should consider canceling the auction.

**B.** Community Christmas Dinner – 51 people were served, most from other Floodwood congregations and surrounding communities.

**C.** Attendance records – Susan will purchase a record book from Concordia Publishing as an example and we will consider making our own.

**D.** Reduce Council number – Susan will bring up for discussion the possible need to reduce the number of Council members due to shrinking service attendance if we do not get members to serve on the church council.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

**A.** Non-member church usage – Discussion was held regarding charging a cleaning fee for use of the church by non-members.

**B.** Lenten suppers – Susan noted that Lenten services will coincide with Homework Help, so she will recommend serving the students from 5-6 pm and serving the soup supper at 6:15 pm. (*Continued on Page 5*)
