# A Word From Pastor Carl

#### FIRST COMMUNION CLASS

Until the end of the 1960's in the Lutheran Church, first communion was connected with the completion of confirmation. Formal study of the sacrament was considered a pre-requisite for partaking in the Lord's Supper. In the early 1970's confirmation began to change. In the predecessor bodies to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), less emphasis was placed on memorization of Luther's Small Catechism and first communion became separated from confirmation. Meals are provided by volunteers. A good, balanced meal is offered because hungry kids cannot learn very well. A light protein snack is offered to kids who come after school and supper is served at 5:00 pm. The students know the expectation that at least one hour will be spent on homework.

We welcome anyone who would like to volunteer to help with either homework or preparing a meal. Since the students are our future in the Floodwood community, we are extending an invitation to everyone in the community who can assist with the Homework Help project.

We will know that this effort is working when we start seeing improved grades and improved academic eligibility.

#### Word from Pastor Carl (Continued From Page 1) FIRST COMMUNION CLASS

The Roman Catholic Church has traditionally offered first communion to students in second grade. As Lutherans become better acquainted with Catholics, some Lutherans began to imitate the Catholic manner of earlier communion although not embracing the Catholic practices entirely. Many of the congregations of the American Lutheran Church (ALC) and the Lutheran Church in America (LCA) (two of the predecessor bodies to form the ELCA, our congregation's former affiliation) began with greater frequency to hold a separate learning time earlier than confirmation specifically for first communion. This class has typically been open to students starting at the fifth grade. Churches now belonging to LCMC (our present affiliation) and NALC have followed this same, more recent pattern. And while not a majority, a good number of churches in the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod have also taken on this younger practice. However, the Wisconsin Synod, The Evangelical Lutheran Synod, the Free Lutherans, the Lutheran Brethren and the many groups of Apostolic Lutherans have moreover retained the practice of first communion upon completing confirmation.

Personally, I like the traditional practice of a more in-depth study at an older age for learning about the importance of the Lord's Supper. But I can certainly understand how younger Christians can be ready at an earlier age and I am very willing to have a first communion class for fifth grade and up. The class will begin on Sundays during the worship service with Liz Thom leading instruction. I will teach the final class at a different time apart from the worship service hour. All who are interested from the fifth grade and older are invited to attend beginning with the first class on Sunday, January 11 at 9:30 downstairs.

**Pastor:** Activities report attached. Pastor Fiskness reported Arna Rennan will not be presenting a concert in December. **Youth & Family, Education:** There will be no Religious Release or Sunday School classes until school resumes in January; Pastor will begin First Communion classes in January; approximately 6-8 families took advantage of the child care provided on Christmas Shopping Night. Wednesday night homework help is going well with 17-25 students attending. 
