Nuclear, extended and church families all experience conflict. Paul wrote a number of his epistles to congregations where discord was taking place.

The church experiences conflicts for a variety of reasons. While Jesus' righteousness makes the believers saints, at the same time we are still sinners. Because the sinful nature remains, many conflicts in the congregation are simply personality disagreements.

Besides interpersonal difficulties, there are varying ideas of which ministries are priorities. There can be divergent opinions about how the church should be staffed. There are different ideas about maintaining the church building. Differences also arise from time to time over matters of biblical interpretation and church teaching.

We tend to think of these disagreements as being only negative. And indeed much of the outcome of church conflict generates a lot of heat but sheds little light. But some positives can come from disagreements in the Body of Christ.

Conflict can have a way of helping expose genuine dedication. Hearing people talk about a disagreement can yield information on what their objectives or hopes are. Because most conflicts often require reevaluating the steps that led up to the crisis and a more careful evaluation of the matter in contention, congregational strife can help the local church refine its loyalties and objectives. About the seminar from Kevin McClure: I think the best time to teach on Conflict Management (I used the word management instead of resolution because outcomes can not be guaranteed) is when a church is not in conflict. What I share about UNITY constitutes the first part of the seminar and it lays the groundwork for learning conflict skills. The CONFLICT part of the seminar will help those in attendance to distinguish the "fight worth having" from hills that are not worth dying on and will provide a practical process to create a culture of honor in the local church. All in all, the seminar provides tools to help create a healthy church culture where people can learn to disagree without being disagreeable."

About Kevin McClure: "I've been a follower of Christ for 43 years and a pastor for nearly 37. I will celebrate 40 years of marriage to my bride Laura. We have four grown children and three grandchildren. I serve as a church planter, seminary dean, seminar and conference speaker and consultant.
