PASTOR'S CORNER

Advent

Greetings members of Hope Lutheran Church. The seasons pass by so quickly. We are moving from fall and harvest time, which includes thanksgiving, into winter, advent season and preparation for Christmas. The word "advent" is derived from the Latin word adventus meaning coming. During the 4th and 5th centuries in Spain and Gaul it was a time of preparation for baptism of new Christians at the January feast of Epiphany, the time associated with the visit of the Magi to the baby Jesus.

During this time Christians would spend 40 days in penance, prayer and fasting to prepare for this celebration. By the 6th century Roman Christians tied advent to the coming of Christ but not to his first coming at Christmas but rather His second coming in the clouds as judge of the world. It was not until the middle ages that the Advent season became linked to Christ's first coming at Christmas. (*continued page 3*)

Pastor Burgess opened with Prayer.

Meeting called to order at 11:06 AM by Mark Johnsen.

Pastors Report: Pastor John provided a written report and verbally highlighted several items. Some of the items highlighted included: Meeting with Floodwood

Ministerium, BRTA Graduation Oct 5-6 in Des Moines, LCMC Annual Meeting in Des Moines, donated old samples of ReClaim hymnals to a congregation in New York, elected to the Board of the Epiphany District, and successful ordination and installation service.

Administrator's Report Jeff's report was provided in packet. CCLI reporting period ended and all data submitted. XEROX copier will be removed soon.

Cost of approximately \$25+ for adding an additional insured to our policy if required.

Minutes of the October meeting were published in the Beacon of Hope, and upon motion by Susan Coccie, seconded by Jan Benson, were approved by the members.

Jeanette Johnsen's treasurer report showed a starting balance of \$288.80 as of Sept. 10, and after income and expenses, including \$1,680 from apple pie sales, a balance of \$1,720.05, and a savings balance of \$636.07. After designated funds of \$1,744.69, the total available funds is \$611.43. The report was approved upon motion by Carolyn Hosking, seconded by Ann Lundstrom and a vote of all in favor.

Under old business, Grace thanked everyone for all the help with the apple pie project and in advance for all the effort put in for the annual Christmas Bazaar and dinner set for Wednesday evening of this week.

Under New Business, Hope release time teachers are asking for HLCW to supply treats for the approximate fifteen students. Jeanette reported that Clothing Etc. plans to contribute \$200 to each of the five local churches, which will probably take care of the teachers' request.

Cookie Day will be on Dec. 9 this year with Rebecca Circle in charge. Everyone will be asked to bring four dozen cookies that day, packed about four in a zip-lock bag for packing in many containers which will be distributed to the list of homebound throughout the Floodwood area. It was agreed to also send cookies to the Lifehouse

in Duluth again as well as Riverview Manor here in Floodwood.

It was also agreed that HLCW will collect items for the crisis shelter and women's shelter in Duluth which will be brought and placed under our Christmas tree. Jeanette will have the list of items needed for this project.

There being no other business, Grace declared the meeting adjourned at 11:30.

Today we balance the two elements of remembrance and anticipation. The first two Sundays in Advent look forward to Christ's second coming and the last two Sunday's backward to remember look Christ's first coming. As part of our celebration during this time we incorporate the lighting of candles of the advent wreath. The advent wreath was first developed in Germany in 1839 by a Lutheran minister working at a children's mission when he created a wreath out of an old wagon wheel with twenty small red candles on the rim and four large white candles inside the ring. The red candles were lit on weekdays and the white candles on

Sundays. Eventually the advent wreath was made up of evergreens symbolizing everlasting life in the midst of winter and death. The circle structure reminds us of God's unending love and eternal life He makes possible.



Candles are nestled in the evergreen wreath with four candles around a central white candle. One candle is lit each of the four Sundays in Advent with the central candle lit on Christmas to celebrate Jesus' birth. Often the first, second and fourth are purple or blue with the third candle being rose colored. The candles are lit representing Christ, the light of the world. It is only in the shadow of advent that the miracle of Christmas can be fully understood and appreciated, since it is only in the light of Christmas that the Christian life makes any sense. It is between the fulfilled promise of Christ's first coming and the yetto-be-fulfilled promise of His second coming, that we all are preparing for while we are waiting. It is my prayer that you will come and join us this advent season and Christmas as we celebrate the comings of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

May God richly bless you this Advent Season.

Thank you to everyone who worked to make our bazaar a success, especially LuAnn and the Mary Circle. Thank you to all who donated baked goods and new items.


So far over \$900.00 has been deposited, with items purchased for the meal yet to be paid. Christmas and other cards are still available. See Jeanette if interested.
