HLCW MINUTES

November 12, 2019

The meeting was called to order by President Grace Autio following the Bible study. Eight members were present.

The minutes of the October meeting were published in the Beacon and upon motion by Elvi Tollgaard, seconded by Jan Benson, were voted approved by all.

Jeanette Johnsen distributed her report which showed a checking balance of \$1,134.47 as of November 12, 2019; and after income of \$878.00 and expenses of \$114.38, there remained a checking balance of \$1,898.09. The savings balance of \$436.55 remained unchanged and after designated funds (pies) of \$1,503.62, the balance in available funds is \$831.02. Upon motion by Elsie Tollgaard, seconded by Susan Coccie to approve the treasurer's report, the motion was approved by vote of all those present.

President Grace read a thank you note from Vickie Anderson of Zion Lutheran Church in Cloquet, for our HLCW donation of \$100 for allowing us to harvest apples from their orchard for our pie-making project.

Grace noted that the deadline for filling and returning Shoe Boxes is next Sunday, November 17th. Carole and Floyd Ahlgren will once again deliver the boxes to the pickup point. It was noted that several people planned to fill boxes online, which may account for fewer boxes to turn in for the annual blessing next Sunday.

A reminder that the annual Christmas Bazaar is coming up Wednesday, November 20th, and LuAnn Heikkila has the meatball project well in hand as usual. She asks Naomi Circle members to come about 3:00 o'clock that day to help.

Rebecca Circle is in charge of new items and it was decided that items left over from the sale can be brought to Christmas Shopping Night on November 25th for sale there between the hours of 3-7 p.m. Mary Circle is in charge of baked items, and Grace suggested members come by 4:00 to arrange and price the items for sale. The group then went over the list and adjusted prices where needed.


The meeting was adjourned at 11:45 a.m.


