A Word From Pastor Carl

THE RULE OF THREE

There were three significant events in the American Religious landscape in the month of January.

1) The Anglican Communion is a fellowship of churches whose leader is the Archbishop of Canterbury of the Church of England. The feel and flavor of Anglicanism can be described as being halfway in-between Lutheranism and Catholicism. The top bishop from each Anglican Church in a particular country is called the primate. For example, Kenya has one primate. Canada has one primate, etc. The primates recently convened and determined that the Episcopal Church will not be allowed to participate in the Anglican Communion because the Episcopal Church has altered its view on traditional Christian teaching and in particular marriage. This move removes the Episcopal Church out of the 80,000,000 people worldwide fellowship. The smaller Anglican Church in North America, which has recently formed out of the Episcopal Church for similar reasons, remains in good standing with the other world Anglican churches. Word from Pastor Carl - (Continued From Page 1)

2) In the history of American Lutheranism, around a hundred years ago, a movement started to provide the education of two years of Bible School for young people to be trained in the foundation of scripture before beginning college. Another purpose of the school was to provide leadership for young people to return to their congregations to provide Christian leadership. Schools for this purpose were established as the Lutheran Bible Institute in Minneapolis; Teaneck, New Jersey; Seattle, Washington; Irvine, California and Camrose, Alberta. These camps also operated Mount Carmel camp outside of Alexandria, MN, which is now an independent Lutheran camp and retreat center.

Beginning in the 1960's, the New Jersey campus closed and Seattle, Minneapolis and Camrose converted into more general two year Lutheran colleges. Minneapolis' campus moved out to Golden Valley and later closed in 1985 and is now the Perpich School for the Arts. (Interestingly, Flip Saunders began his basketball coaching career the at Golden Valley.) The California school has downgraded into a Bible study program disseminating and producing Bible Study material for congregations. Like the Minneapolis school moving to Golden Valley and becoming a college, Seattle LBI became Trinity Lutheran College. The Seattle school announced this month that at the end of this academic year, its doors will close because of declining enrollment. Now only the Canadian School operates as a residential college program.

3. The oldest Lutheran seminary (school for training pastors) in the country is at Gettysburg, PA and the Lutheran Theological Seminary in Philadelphia announced they will begin the process of merging to form one school. The Gettysburg seminary played a prominent role as a hospital during the Civil War battle. In 1864, for reasons unrelated to the war but for the concern that the teaching at Gettysburg was not Lutheran enough, the Philadelphia school began and the two have been separate schools ever since. For the immediate future, both campus will be used while the two institutions become one new reality but cost will likely dictate that one location will eventually emerge.
