THE SURVEY SAYS....

Included in the annual meeting packet was an important questionnaire for all members of the congregation. This survey was commissioned by the church council to gather opinions about the needs and desires for Hope Lutheran Church. The council unanimously decided that we want the categories on the paper to be open-ended to make sure that any ideas that you are thinking have a place to be expressed.

It seems to me that there are two general uses for a questionnaire. The first way that people use surveys is how a customer in a restaurant or at a hotel wants to either highly compliment the service that went beyond and above expectations or share a specific grievance that should have not happened.

The second kind of survey that I have observed is more a set of questions that are meant to tap into subconscious thoughts. While I expect that there will be a number of answers that will fit more in the former category of obvious concerns, I am hoping that this feedback will not only note more conspicuous issues but also elicit and imagine and ask questions of "What if...?" *(Continued on Page 4)*

Grace noted that the new monthly coffee sign-up list is okay for this year.

Hope Council member Susan Coccie reported that church attendance is down 25% in the last five years, and the council has made up a questionnaire to give members at the annual meeting, asking for ideas of what we can do to improve membership in the future. The questionnaires will also be sent out to members by mail for comments and ideas.


