Meeting was called to order by President Mark Johnsen at 6:00 pm Pastor Julie opened with prayer.

AGENDA

A motion made by Coccie to approve the agenda with two additions, second by Tollgaard.

REPORTS

Secretary: Motion by Seredinski to approve the minutes of the December 14, 2017 meeting, second by Coccie. Motion carried.

Financial: Motion by Tollgaard, second by Hutchinson to approve the December financial report. Motion carried.

Pastor: Written report provided.

Christian Education and Youth:

Our Wednesday night Lenten services will begin on February 21st, with soup suppers at 6 pm, followed by informal worship services that focus on character sketches of not so likely people that were a part of Holy Week, the culmination of the Lenten season.

We will need actors to portray these characters, so if the Holy Spirit has prodded you gently to tell their story, please come see me. The scripts are pre-written so you don't have to create dialog, but we do need you to make these characters come alive for us!

Maybe we think that we, too, are insignificant characters this Lenten season, but I can assure you that we're not; any heart that turns back to Jesus to be renewed, that walks the 40-day journey with Him, is a pilgrim on it.

Traditionally, people have given up something for Lent-maybe a favorite food or drink-or a bad habit. More recently, the trend has been to add something instead, as a Lenten sacrifice. Reading a Psalm each day, or an entire book of the Bible that has significant prophecies of Christ, maybe Daniel or Isaiah, are good suggestions, should you choose to go that route.

Last year during Lent, I gave up texting during my daily Devotions, but I added making a place on the couch specially for Jesus and pictured having a meaningful discussion of the texts with Him.

Whatever you choose to do sacrificially during Lent, please remember that each Sunday is your Sabbath Rest from it; give thanks to God for that +.

Lent is a time for penitence, but that's not the same as guilt or self-hate; rather it's a time to turn to Christ and away from anything or anyone who would draw us away from the One Who made such a great Sacrifice for us (John 15:13). Let's embrace it as a congregation. With Joy, Pastor J

HLCW Meeting JANUARY 9, 2018

President Grace Autio called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m. following the Bible Study. Nine members were present. Grace opened the meeting with a prayer.

As the December 2017 minutes were published in the January issue of The Beacon of Hope, a motion to approve the minutes as published was made by Susan Coccie, and seconded by Shirley Johnson. Grace called for a vote and the motion was approved by all present.

Jeanette Johnsen's treasurer's report showed a balance in checking as of Nov. 13, 2017, of \$1,783.08. Income was \$2,056.50 (including the Christmas bazaar income of \$1,416.50), and expenses of \$3,582.50, leaving a checking balance as of Dec. 31, 2017 of \$257.08. The savings balance as of 12-31-17 was \$135.53 and a transfer from checking of \$500.06 was made to show a balance in savings of \$635.59. After designated funds of \$527.81 (for campers, B. Wain Memorial and Penny Jar), there is a balance of available funds of \$364.86.

Correspondence included a thank you message from Judy Yund for our contribution to her clinic in Bolivia; and a note of thanks from Deanna Hakala for the gift of Christmas cookies.

Under Old business, Grace reported she bought batts for making baby quilts; and Carole Ahlgren added that she bought several batts also.

Under New business, Grace passed around copies of the three HLCW Circles list of members, noting that fewer people seem to be available to help with kitchen and other Circle duties during the year. She noted that the circles could be cut down to two; however, that would probably mean too much responsibility for the more active members during the year. Members are asked to think about this and come up with any solutions that may be available.

Grace noted that Liz Thom is no longer in charge of the Befrienders project and suggested that our group may be able to take on the responsibility together. A motion was made by Susan, seconded by Shirley that HLCW take on Befrienders as a group, and write out cards from a list brought to the group each month. When Grace asked for a vote on this, everyone agreed.

There being no other business, the meeting was declared adjourned at 11:30 a.m.
