Pastor John Burgess opened with prayer.

Meeting was called to order at 8:02 AM by Mark Johnsen.

Motion by Dean Fries, 2nd by Tanya Johnson to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Secretaries Report

Treasurers Report

Reviewed October and November Financial reports. Motion by Tanya Johnson, and 2nd by Deb Tollgaard to approve the Treasurers reports as submitted. Motion carried. (Note: One check for Sam's Club was not included for \$94.58, it will be included next time.)

Pastors Report

Pastor Burgess provided a written report. The highlights: continued visits with communion to shut-ins and added Steve Bennett at the apartments and Lilly Autio in Duluth. He participated in Lila Niskanen's funeral. Continues to work with religious release confirmation classes and students. The religious release group will be Christmas caroling at Riverview Apartments with New Life Church. He will be the Pastor at Love Lights a Tree.

Administrator's Report

Jeff Kletscher's report was provided in the packet, it included in financial report; Rental update: the garage was rented to Lamping's for \$40 a month and they plow and keep driveway open. No more bills will be sent to collect from individual family on Camp Patmos. Fund for Religious Release for snacks, balance forward \$112.22. Community Vacation Bible School change, \$267.95. HLCW MINUTES HLCW Minutes January 14, 2020

The meeting was called to order by President Grace Autio following the Bible study. Seven members were present.

The minutes of the December 10, 2019 minutes as published in the Beacon was unanimously approved as read.

Jeanette Johnsen's treasurers report showed a checking balance as of Nov. 12, 2019, \$1,898.09. After income of \$1,527.06 (including pie sales of \$1,338.55), and expenses of \$3,390.67, there remained a checking balance of \$34.47. With a savings balance of \$436.66, there remains a balance of total available funds of \$471.13.

Motion by Jan Benson, seconded by Elvi Tollgaard to accept the treasurer's report, and the motion was approved by those present.

Grace read thank you notes from Bev Davidson and Dennis and Marilyn Arro for the Christmas cookies.

Judy Yund, leader of the Bethel Foundation in Bolivia, Sent a letter of thanks for our support of the foundation and reported on the political situation in that country.

Grace also read letters from missionary families the Ekkas and the Juhls.

President Grace noted that Ash Wednesday is February 26 this year, and our HLCW will probably be helping the youth serve the soup suppers although it hasn't been mentioned as yet.

A quilting session is set for January 28.

This meeting was also the time for the HLCW annual election, however as no one was interested in taking over the president's position, Grace agreed to continue in that job. Susan Coccie consented to take over the position of Secretary, which she will assume in February.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 11:00 a.m.
