#### HLCW Meeting December 12, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 11:15 following the Bible Study. President Grace Autio presided. Nine members were present. Minutes of the November 14th meeting were approved as published in the Beacon of Hope, upon motion by Susan Coccie, seconded by Carolyn Hosking.

Jeanette Johnsen's treasurer's report showed pie profits of \$1,461.00 and profits from the Christmas bazaar of \$1,296.66, for a total of \$2,757.66. The profits from these projects are \$588.00 more than realized last year.

Grace reported that all 210 apple pies have been sold. It was also reported that cookies designated to the Duluth Lighthouse will be delivered by the Hope youth and Carol Ahlgren will be asked to deliver donated items to the Bethany Crisis Center in Duluth.

As HLCW has more funds than usual in its account at this time of the year, a discussion was held to decide what projects would benefit the most with some HLCW aid.

Jeanette noted that the \$500 roof refund was added to the youth camper fund, and the youth group adds to that with fundraisers during the year, and as Quake Zone is coming up again in March 2018, the youth will need more funds to participate in that. Pastor Julie remarked that Quake Zone for Youth includes hotel rooms and the church may be called upon to help fill out the expenses. Youth families will be asked to contribute \$50.00 towards expenses.

It was moved by Jeanette that the HLCW contribute \$1000.00 for the youth Quake Zone project this year, and give \$1,757.66 to the Hope General Fund. The motion was seconded by Anne Lundstrom, and all voted in favor. There being no other business, Grace declared the meeting adjourned at 11:30 a.m.
