Meeting was called to order at 8:01 AM by Mark Johnsen.

Motion by Tanya Johnson, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Deb Tollgaard to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

#### **Secretaries Report**

September Council Minutes - Motion by Pat Seredinski, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Deb Tollgaard to approve minutes as submitted, with adjustment to Outreach committee report. Adjustment is to read, How another Lutheran church made others feel welcome. Motion carried.

#### HLCW MINUTES December 10, 2019

The meeting was called to order by President Grace Autio following the Bible study. Eight members were present.

The minutes of the November meeting as published in The Beacon were upon motion by Shirley Johnson, seconded by Jan Benson, accepted by those present.

A brief report by treasurer Jeanette Johnsen showed a balance of \$3,200.68 in checking and a savings balance of \$436.55, totaling \$3,637.23. Designated funds of \$1,661.62 from pies and \$1,200.59 from the bazaar total \$2,862.21, leaving available funds of \$775.02. A motion by Elsie Tollgaard, seconded by Elvi Tollgaard to accept the report as given by Jeanette, was voted yes by all.

President Grace reported that the bazaar went well, especially sales of baked goods and the very good meal headed by LuAnn Heikkila and her kitchen crew. New items were not well received again this year and there followed a discussion about whether it should continue to be included next year. It was noted that new items sold better at the Christmas Shopping Night event on November 25th.

Cookies were packed and distributed locally after the service on December 8. It was decided that because of the over-large number of cookies contributed, it would be better to bring three dozen each instead of four dozen each next year. Jeanette will bring the surplus amount to Life House in Duluth again this year.

Under New Business, Grace reminded us that the annual First Lutheran Christmas luncheon in Meadowlands will be held this coming Thursday, December 12 at noon. Those planning to attend from Floodwood should meet at the church at 11:30 a.m. for a ride to Meadowlands.

The Hope Annual Meeting and potluck will be coming up in January, with Mary Circle in charge of the potluck.
