# A Word From Pastor Carl

hristian stewardship includes the members of the congregation giving their tithes and offerings. As the offering is received, it is customary that some of the contribution is earmarked to ministries beyond Hope Lutheran Church. This benevolence happens in at least two different ways.

The first way that we give to ministries beyond our congregation is through spontaneous one-time collections for project such as Gideons Bible distribution ministry, the Military Bible Sticks, Youth Encounter or Vision Petrozavodsk in Russia. This often occurs through the globe offering or using colored envelopes for special projects.

The second way that we contribute to ministry beyond our community is through budgeted financial support. Each year before the annual meeting, the budget committee presents a proposed ministry spending plan to the church council. The council considers and then endorses the proposal and afterwards presents the budget for the congregation's annual meeting to approve.

#### Christian Education & Youth & Family Ministry:

*Homework Help*: The Outreach Committee is in the process of evaluating the response and benefits of providing homework help to students in elementary and high school. It's been a learning process and not just for the students! On the positive side, this has truly been a community concern and we have been grateful for the willing helpers both for homework and supper preparations. We have realized there is an "ebb & flow" to the project so that may have a bearing on how many volunteer tutors for various subjects are needed. We had more high school students coming 2 weeks into the semester rather than at the beginning of the semester. We also found that by having other creative learning tasks, especially for elementary students to do during their break time, made better use of the time. We had a kit that kids could put together to make an FM radio and another to generate power by using a crank to create electricity to run a clock, siren or radio; and "mouse trap vehicles" where directions needed to be followed accurately so the car would go; as well as puzzles of the United States to help the kids learn geography. A big thank you goes to Nathan Seredinski who helped the kids understand circuits and electricity.

In the recent past, we enjoyed the presence of WMPL personnel Nijhar and Neeraj Ekka and family from Ranchi, India who visited for a number of years during Vacation Bible School week.

Beyond WMPL, Robert Suhonen grew up in Cromwell. He and his Swedish wife Ulla have made periodic visits while on furlough and have personally provided us riveting accounts of their dynamic work around the globe. We also have been supporting on a smaller scale Lutheran Social Service and our association, Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ (LCMC)

Regarding mission and every other expense, the church council recognized at our May meeting that our spending has not been nimble enough in adjusting to income. Because of this, our level of financial support to missions beyond our congregation needs to temporarily be placed in abeyance. This decision brings me great sadness considering the important work that these organizations conduct as they represent us on the field. While the council laments that we are presently unable to financially back our partners in ministry, it was reasoned and regretfully acknowledged that if our monetary support beyond the congregation will not be adjusted to meet revenue and expenditures now, there will be no chance for future sponsorship with these ministries.

It is our intention that as soon as our situation calibrates that Hope Lutheran Church will be able to not only offer our prayers but our offering dollars for those who engage in Gospel work on the frontlines. We hope and pray that other congregations do need not to duplicate our temporary action.
