#### WORD FROM PASTOR

#### Our Youth-Whereunto Bound?

I recently came across an article by the editor of Ansgar Lutheran magazine, in an edition that was printed in 1960. I had been thinking about our Youth; planning the Baccalaureate service that will be at Hope Lutheran Church at the end of May, so the name of the article, "Youth: WhitherBound?" caught my eye. The article began by referencing a quote by FDR from an address to Milton Academy in 1926 titled, "Whitherbound," that in essence said FDR practically worshipped the coming generation; they were working out their own salvation, they were more in love with life than those previously, and they were playing with fire openly, where before it had been done in secret, and few of them were being burned!

The author of the article (in 1960) felt the same concern that I do in 2018. He said that Youth are treated with Kid Gloves because their parents think that the kids are smarter and more talented than they were. Don't be intimidated, says the author. True, they may have been exposed to more experiences at the same age than their parents (live, and through media) but that doesn't make parents intellectually inferior.

#### **Secretaries Report**

Parents have more consolidated knowledge than their children, and more experience, which gives them a nice layer of patina that their children won't have 'til they go out and live life, taking the fall for mistakes made and readjusting their GPS.

I love that Mark Twain said when he was 17, he thought his father was the stupidest man that ever lived. When he turned 21, he was surprised at how much the Old Man had learned in 4 years!

We pray that the instruction, especially religious instruction, that we've given our kids an upbringing that will provide a good solid base for life before they are launched. (Prov. 3: 5-6)

I graduated from high school many years ago, but I do remember a poem that impacted me greatly at that time. It was "If" by Rudyard Kipling. In the same edition of the Ansgar Magazine, I found the "Christian 's If" reprinted from the Christian Recorder (South Africa).

Perhaps it will provide encouragement for our physically strong, mentally quick, and youthfully impetuous ones as they venture out into the big 'ole world of opportunities and challenges awaiting them.

The Christian's If (sorry, Rudyard Kipling!)

If you can trust when everyone about you is doubting Him, proclaiming Him untrue;
If you can hope in Christ tho' all forsake you

And say 'tis not the thing for you to do;

If you can wait on God, nor wish to hurry,

Or being greatly used, keep humble still:

Or, if you're tested, still refuse to worry,

And so remain within His sovereign Will,

If you can say 'tis well when sorrow greets you,

And death has taken those you hold dear;

If you can smile when adverse trials meet you,

And be content e'en tho' your lot be drear.

Or, being tempted, not give way to sin:

If you can fight for right and stand the firmer,

Or lose the battle when you ought to win;

If you can really long for his appearing

And therefore set your heart on things above;

If you can speak for Christ in spite of sneering,

Or to the most unlovely one show love:

If you can hear to call of God to labour,

And answer "Yes," in yieldness and trust,

Our Sunday School Coordinator, Sheryl Abell, has requested not to teach from June-August.




