A Word From Pastor Carl

HAPPY ANNIVERSARY

It occurred to me recently when reviewing the history of our congregations, that 2015 marks the 50th anniversary of Hope Lutheran Church. As I was reading from Floodwood's history book, exploratory meetings for the possible union of Bethany and Trinity Lutheran Churches began in the summer of 1965. From the progress of these meetings, representatives eventually drafted a proposal for a merger. The members of both churches voted to merge on December 12, 1965. By the spring of 1966, the blending of the two congregations was accomplished.

From my reading and listening to stories from some of you, I have gathered that there were at least three reasons that propelled the congregations towards merger. (Please feel free to correct me if I have perceived anything incorrectly.)

Trinity was originally a Scandinavian congregation of a majority of Norwegians but also Swedes and Danes. The pastor served not only Trinity but also Bethany in Cromwell and later Bethlehem in Wright. Bethany Lutheran of Floodwood was a congregation affiliated with the Suomi Synod consisting of Finnish congregations.

First, ethnic differences were diminishing. Trinity had long moved away from the Norwegian language in its worship. At Bethany, however, into the 1950's, pastors came to serve who were originally from Finland or who were stronger in their Finnish speaking skills than English. With the passage of time, English evolved into being the primary language for worship and a resident Finnish-speaking pastor was no longer needed by the majority. While the language transition was made at Bethany, worship in Finnish continued into the earlier years even at Hope by pastors who visited to lead a Finnish service. (*Continued on Page 4*)

Hope Lutheran Church Minutes of Special Meeting October 4, 2015

A quorum was confirmed by the ushers. Church secretary Marion Shafer confirmed the meeting date and time had been published in two consecutive bulletins and the newsletter.

Meeting was called to order by President Susan Coccie at 10:31 am.

Susan stated the sole purpose of this meeting was to make the congregation aware of the financial situation of Hope Lutheran.

Susan called attention to the handout, which included a graph of Attendance, Income and Expenses from 2003 to 2014, and a Budget Report. She explained that utility expenses for both the church building and the parsonage have increased; we have stopped providing financial support to various ministries; and the subscription for Portals of Prayer has been discontinued. On the positive side, employee expenses are down due to fewer hours worked by the janitor and secretary, and there is a \$570 per month savings since Pastor Fiskness switched to Jodi's health insurance.

Thanks to an increase in giving in August, the church is currently \$1,586.78 in the black, but not without some sacrifices.

The Endowment Fund balance is approximately \$60,000, and Susan reminded the congregation that it is meant to be used for special circumstances, not normal expenses.

Susan ended with thanking Jeff Kletscher for his help in preparing the budget report and assuring the members that the Council is making tough decisions and trying to be good stewards of Hope's finances.

Pastor Fiskness reminded the congregation that they can subscribe to Portals of Prayer individually and closed the meeting with prayer.

Meeting adjourned at 10:46 am.

Related to the transition of the language, the demographics also began to change. I have never read this anywhere but from what I have heard and have read between the lines, Trinity had become the larger of the two congregations and that some dissatisfaction developed in the leadership in Bethany. Furthermore, as cultural differences were less emphasized, intermarriage became more frequent.

Third, the practice of consolidation in Floodwood was a microcosm of the experience throughout the country. Even the national church bodies of both congregations had recently participated in mergers. Trinity entered into the merger of the American Lutheran Church (ALC) in 1960 and Bethany was part of the merger of the Lutheran Church in America in 1962.

As the planning will progress in how we will celebrate our history, may this year be a special season of reflection. What new and exciting things could God have in store for us? What new things are possible? May this year be a season of reflection. And may this year help us also to think more intentionally of how God is going to continue to use us into the future to reach and be a blessing for our community.

President Grace Autio opened the meeting in Hope Lutheran Fellowship Hall at 10:00 a.m. with a prayer. Ten members were present. Upon motion made by Susan Coccie, seconded by Lois Hendrickson, the minutes of the September meeting were approved as published in the October Beacon of Hope.

Treasurer Jeanette Johnsen distributed her report for the month which showed as of October 12, 2015, a checking balance of \$437.35; a savings balance of \$1,035.04 plus interest of \$.26. After designated funds of \$351.87, the report showed a balance of available funds of \$1,120.78. Upon motion by Elsie Tollgaard, seconded by Liz Thom, the treasurer's report was unanimously approved.

Under old business, Grace reported that the recent rummage sale went well, netting \$973.00. She also reported that they would be going after apples at Apple Hill Orchard, Bayfield the next day (Oct. 14), for 9 bushels of apples at \$17.00 per bushel for the HLCW pie making sessions set for Thursday and Friday of this week.

The question of this year's charge for the pies was discussed and upon motion by Lois, seconded by Elvi Tollgaard, and unanimously approved, the pies will be sold this year for \$8.00 each.

Under new business, it was noted that Telisha Bennett lately gave birth and her little girl is named Ella Jean. Our group will have a baby shower for the Bennetts and their new addition on Sunday, November 8 at 11:00 a.m. in the fellowship hall following coffee time.

Grace reminded the group of the Fall Bazaar coming up on November 18. The next HLCW meeting will be held Tuesday, November 10, at 10:00 a.m.

There being no other business, Grace adjourned the meeting at 10:30, and the ensuing Bible study was conducted by Liz Thom.


