#### **HLCW MEETING OCTOBER 11, 2016**

President Grace Autio opened the meeting at 10:10 a.m. with 12 members present. Minutes of the Sept. 13 meeting were read and approved as read.

Grace introduced Ann Lundstrom and welcomed her as the newest member, to HLCW.

Treasurer Jeanette Johnsen gave a brief unofficial report, noting that she was going to deposit \$1,244.00 for apple pie sales and expects an additional \$164.00 to come in for the remaining pies that aren't paid for. After expenses Jeanette reported that \$1,383.96 is in available checking. It was moved by Lois Hendrickson, seconded by Elsie Tollgaard, to approve the report. All approved.

Grace reported there are six pies remaining. A total of 191 apple pies were made with the help of 22 or 23 people both days.

She noted the upcoming Christmas Bazaar is set for Nov. 16, and Cookie Can Sunday will be December 11. On that day members are asked to each bring 4 dozen cookies which will be gift-packed for local distribution and to Life House in Duluth.

Operation Christmas Child. The annual Shoe Box project will be coming up soon, and the boxes will be due by November 13 ready for shipping to overseas destinations the following week.

There being no other business, Grace called the meeting adjourned at 10:20.

#### A Word From Pastor Carl (Continued from page 1)

William Brewster served as governor of Pilgrims from 1621-1657. His writing, "Of Plymouth Plantation" is the most important source for knowledge about the settlement in its early years including, of course, the first Thanksgiving in 1621.

Another of the settlers to play a key role was Richard Brewster. Brewster was the most educated of the congregation as he had both political and diplomatic experience. From the Pilgrims' previous community in Leiden in the Netherlands, Brewster published material critical of the King of England and was therefore an outlaw. Alden and his family snuck aboard the Mayflower and served as their pastor until one finally arrived from England years later.

John Alden was not a member of the Pilgrims but was hired by the congregation to be their cooper (barrel maker). He married into the congregation with his union to Priscilla Mullins. Alden was the last survivor of the Mayflower Compact and today has the most descendants of any of the original families.

The successful governance of the Pilgrims is also due to John Carver who was the author of the Mayflower Compact, its first signer and was elected the first governor of the colony. Sadly, he died due to heat exhaustion before the first thanksgiving.

Another famous person of the Plymouth settlement was Miles Standish. Standish was hired as a professional soldier for the Pilgrims and is known for his competing courtship for the attention of Priscilla Mullins. Standish tended to be aggressive in military tactics although he is credited with rescuing Squanto from capture by other aboriginal peoples. *(Continued on Page 4)*

Besides Squanto, there were two other significant Native American contributors to the survival of the Plymouth Colony. These two were Hobbamock and Massasoit. All three were important in educating the Pilgrims about fishing and farming advice. These men possessed rare talents with the English language and with political and military negotiations between the indigenous people and the settlers.

And so as the Pilgrims (and the Natives gathered) together for a festival to thank God for deliverance through their first winter, let us thank our Lord for another year of provision. Plan to attend Thanksgiving Eve service on Wednesday, November 23 at 7:00 PM.
