### HLCW MINUTES OCTOBER 10, 2017

Nine members were present at the meeting which began at 10:50 a.m. following the bible study conducted by Carolyn Hosking. President Grace Autio called the meeting to order.

Minutes of the September 12 meeting were approved as published in the October Beacon of Hope.

An informal treasurer's report was given by Jeanette Johnsen who noted \$135.53 in savings and \$380.86 in checking, for a total of \$516.39. after designated funds of \$27.81, available funds at this time total \$488.58. Jeanette reported that she has written a check for apples at \$17.00 per bushel, which the Hoskings' will be picking up at a Bayfield orchard on Wednesday. A thank you note for the baptism quilt was read from Mr. and Mrs. Trenton Bailey and baby Matthew.

Apple Pie making days are this week: Thursday and Friday, beginning at 9:00 a.m.

A letter was received from the church council asking HLCW what to do with the \$500 that is being returned to the organization from the roof fund. After much discussion it was decided to restore the money to the depleted Campership Fund, upon motion by Jeanette Johnsen, seconded by Carolyn Hosking, with all voting in favor.

Grace reminded the group that the annual Christmas Bazaar is a month away - Wednesday, November 15, and LuAnn Heikkila has consented to be in charge of the kitchen. Other departments include: new items, Mary circle; serving lunch, Rebecca circle, and the bakery table, Naomi circle.

A list of items needed for the parsonage is being circulated in the church for the interim pastor that will be arriving this month, in about two weeks. It was decided that this group could contribute a new microwave oven, which could be returned to the church kitchen when the interim pastor leaves and a permanent pastor moves here. The motion was made to do that by Elvi Tollgaard, seconded by Jan Benson, and upon vote, everyone agreed. Nancy Raihala was designated to purchase the microwave for the church, which may cost between \$50 and \$100. The meeting closed with a prayer, including a request for conflict resolution within our church family. Meeting adjourned at 11:15.
