Treasurer's Report

Reviewed August financial report. Motion by Tanya Johnson, and 2nd by Pat Seredinski to approve the Treasure's report as submitted. Motion carried.

Pastors Report

Pastor Burgess provided a written report, 6 visits with shut-ins and 6 communions given. Gave out copies of the Daily Bread and they were well received. 12 hours of premarital counseling was given.

Religious release preparation is underway. Preparing for two funerals in September. Cindy and Pastor are taking pictures of the shut-ins for the directory. Officiating a wedding October 19. In October a study of spiritual gifts as part of the series on Who Broke My Church will be conducted. This will help members identify their gifts and how they will allow the members to become better disciples. Pastor had vacation September 16 - 20 and will take another vacation October 2 - 9 to visit the grandkids.

Administrator's Report

There is a savings balance of \$436.55, and designated funds (pies) of \$775.00, leaving an available funds balance of \$796.02. Motion was made by Elvi Tollgaard and seconded by Shirley Johnson to approve the report as read. All voted aye in favor of the report.

Grace read a correspondence from John and Tammy Juhl, formerly of Floodwood, and now John serves Stavanger Lutheran Church in Fergus Falls, MN. They are also missionaries and have recently served an area of the Sudan in Africa. Grace also read Thank You notes from the family of Rose Chambers, and from Liz and Wayne Thom, who recently transferred church membership to Cloquet.

Pres. Grace reported on a very successful two days of apple pie making, during which about 240 pies were made with lots of help from members who picked the apples and worked on preparing and making the pies.

Under New Business, Grace reminded us that the annual Shoe Box time is nearing, and a number of the boxes have been ordered for members to fill before the November deadline.

LuAnn Heikkila has again consented to be in charge of the kitchen and will make the meatballs for the annual bazaar on November 20.

There being no further business, Pres. Grace declared the meeting closed at 11:45 a.m.
