his past January, Dave and I were on our way home from Homework Help at church, when we got the call that our 3-year-old granddaughter, Willa, had been diagnosed with a rare form of kidney cancer; a Wilms tumor.

She had been to the doctor numerous times since November because she wasn't eating and she was losing weight. She had no energy. The diagnosis went from anemia to bladder infection to lactose intolerant. Finally, in January she was so sick, the doctors decided to do some imaging. They found a tumor that took up most of her abdomen.

I cried and PRAYED without ceasing for three days. I went to bed on Friday night and slept the best I had in months. I woke with such a peace about Willa. The Lord told me that she was going to be fine. He didn't tell me that my faith in his promise would be tested repeatedly. *(Continued on Page 3)*

#### (Continued from page 1)GOD'S PROMISES

I flew out to Spokane, Washington on Monday following her diagnosis and God knew that I still needed encouragement, peace and strength. In His graciousness, he met my needs by making it possible, on the plane from Denver to Spokane, to have a wonderful Christian woman from New Mexico be my only seat mate. We talked, cried and prayed together during the entire flight. She was a prayer warrior and was in a prayer group and promised to pray for Willa. This was a sign to me; God's promise fulfilled.

When I look back on Willa's seven months of treatment; 15 chemo treatments, 6 radiation treatments, 2 abdominal surgeries (one to biopsy the tumor and one to remove the kidney and tumor), 4 CT scans, 3 x-rays, EKGs, numerous lab test and everything else that comes with cancer, I can see God's hand in my life, teaching me to trust in him. Initially the doctors said that x-ray showed a spot on Willa's lung, and that the tumor was growing into the large inferior vena cava (the large lower vein leading from the heart). That meant that she would have to have radiation on her chest for the spot on the lung, which would bring total radiation treatments to 15 (5 a week) and she would have to be put under for each session. Also, a vascular surgeon would need to be present when they removed her kidney and tumor. However, the spot on her lung disappeared during the first 6 weeks of chemo, so she did not need the additional radiation, and the tumor had not penetrated the inferior vena cava; God's promise fulfilled.

During Willa's treatment, there would be times when she would have a bad reaction to the chemo and her white blood cell count would drop dangerously low. Satan just loves it when I doubt God's promises. It was during these times that I had to rebuke Satan and pray without ceasing for Willa and her family. In every instance, Willa would recover without problems; God's promise fulfilled.

Willa's final cancer treatment was on July 25<sup>th</sup>. On August 16<sup>th</sup>, she had her final tests to determine if her treatment had been effective. All her tests came back normal; no cancer present. She will continue follow-up visits for the next five years; **"Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good.** *His love endures forever." Psalm 136:1 (NIV)*


