A Word From Pastor Carl

LEADING UP TO THE ANNUAL MEETING

Our church's constitution dictates that the congregation convenes at least once a year for a business meeting of its membership. It is a requirement of state law that non-profit organizations carry out such a practice. This meeting is required to take place during the month of January as set by the church council. This year's gathering is scheduled following the worship service on January 19 and is followed by a potluck dinner.

Just as it is expected most years, the annual meeting tends to be rather routine. This is not an accident. The annual meeting is purposively designed to be more of a "rubber stamp" of business rather than exploratory discussion. If there is a controversial question presenting itself to the congregation, it is certainly appropriate for discussion and debate to take place at the time. However, extended discourse on controversial issues is more difficult to conduct with a larger number of people. If everyone at the annual meeting were to stand up and share an opinion, the meeting would become much too long. (*Continued on page 2*)

WOMEN'S BIBLE STUDY

Session five of the Family Matters series of women's Bible studies is titled, "There's One in Every Family" - Jacob, the Problem Child. Genesis 25: 24-34 is the basis for this part of the study. Jacob, seen as the "problem child" in his family, eventually becomes the standard bearer for the family's history. In Luke 12:35-48 Jesus uses the image of servants to instruct his disciples about the call to obedience and responsibility. The section pertaining to our congregational "family" life teaches that communication and cooperation are keys to managing potential problem "issues" [or people]. We will meet at the church on January 27 at 10:00 a.m.

The constitution spells out that the congregational meeting (of which the annual meeting is the most typical occurrence) is the highest form of governance in the congregation. There are certain actions that can be made by the congregational meeting. The constitution enumerates some of these decisions as: calling a pastor, purchasing or selling property, and expenditures of money above a certain, pre-determined amount.

Because of the difficult manner of overseeing business in the large venue, the annual meeting elects a council to oversee the ministry of the congregation for the year. This body typically meets once a month but can also be called together for special occasions.

While certainly more agile than the annual meeting, the council is also established to be a body that is more of a facilitator than a doer. Just like the annual meeting, but in a reduced manner, extended conversation on beginning issues in the council meeting is often better left to those with specific experience and expertise. Addressing every issue bogs the council meeting down in minutia and extends the length of the meeting.

To help the council continue to be more of an overseer and less of a doer, the council receives reports and encourages our committees to communicate between meetings. One of the more active reports is from the Christian Education and Youth and Family Ministry. This team has met a number of times, especially for the purposes of coordinating Elementary Religious Release. The Building and Grounds committee has also been consistent in getting together before the council meeting to plan and do its work and present recommendations and updates.

As we soon prepare for another annual meeting and electing a new council, we are reminded how our governance is structured to most effectively plan and carry out the ministry of Hope Lutheran Church.

Meeting called to order by President Dean Fries at 7:16 PM.

Agenda

Motion by Susan Coccie, second by Carlene Jatkola to approve the agenda with additions; motion approved.

Reports

Secretary – Motion by Susan Coccie, second by Carlene Jatkola to approve the October 22, 2013 minutes; motion approved.

Pastor – Reviewed report and mileage.

President – Received two financial reports. The first one we looked at showed the \$10,000 from Endowment Fund for projects.

- 2.7 Misc budget is \$300, \$1,511.92 spent outside job/water or remodel in office expenses.
- 7.4 Building budget is \$1,200, \$5,707.39 expenses outside job/water or remodel in office expenses.
- 7.3 Equipment replacement budget 0, spent \$684.30 flood/remodel.
- 7.6 Elevator Monitoring budget is \$2,000, \$2,628.00 spent new law passed, load test and this was the year to do; done every 5 years.
- 2.6 Administrative budget is \$1,000, \$1331.83 spent \$300 off due to copier.
- 6.15 tax payment former Pastors were paid differently than the current Pastor.

Motion by Susan Coccie, second by Rae Rosemore to approve the financial statement; motion approved.

Youth and Family – Youth are selling Butterbraids; will be at Floodwood's Night of Shopping, November 25th. Release time going well.

Communications and Technology – There is a paragraph on our homepage from Pastor Carl.

Building – Dave and LuAnn checked garden centers for burning bushes and crab trees, all gone for the year. Too late to plant anymore this fall. Dave and Bob re-graded between sidewalks. Bubba will put up changing table. Hand rail didn't get installed yet.

Hope Lutheran Women – Served 95 at the Bazaar on November 13th, great meal. The bazaar was a success.

Old Business

Worship CD's – Jeff said that the week of November 25th the mixer will be installed.

Office remodel – Copier Training on Tuesday, November 26th at 7 PM. Rae Rosemore picked up a small fireproof safe. Rae wants to put the ledger book on a flash drive. The shades for the office are in. Items still needed to be picked up are end tables, clock and mirror.

Operation Christmas Child – 52 boxes were filled and brought to Duluth.

Fire extinguishers – Inspect every 5 or 6 years. 5# one in the mechanical room – cost \$57.00. Refurbish ours at the church. Our church has three. Lonna Hutchinson will talk to the fire inspector (Fire and Industrial Sales) when he comes for the gas company. For insurance reasons he will let us know how many we need.

Church software – Lonna got to talk to one church and they use Quick Books. Flock Base (\$179.00) ties in with Quick Books. Lonna will ask for a demo. We need to look on the Internet and see what's out there. (*Continued on Page 6*)

Contract employee for specific church jobs – talked to Jeff Kletscher about this. Pastor Carl and Dean Fries came up with a list of things for Jeff to do. \$100/week and Jeff would track his time, some more, some less during a week's time; stipend. Re-evaluate in three months. Motion by Rae Rosemore, second by Carlene Jatkola to contract with Jeff Kletscher to do our specific projects for three months, re-evaluate in three months; motion approved. Budget 2014 for 6 months.

Tree decorating – Sunday, December 1st – Family Fun Night. Starts at 4:30 PM, tree decorating, games, bingo, prizes and dinner.

Church budget – Dean Fries will have next month.

Boy Scouts – Someone from the Boy Scouts contacted Hope Lutheran about having at our church and sponsoring. Jeff Kletscher in the past was our Liaison. Regional director should come and speak to the council in December.

Advent Services – don't really have the time. In the past it was an evening service at 7 PM on a Wednesday night and it was a short service. Pastor is not in favor of it.

Sunday, December 15th – Sunday School program.

Globe offering - Motion by Brian Hutchinson, second by Dean Fries to have the Globe offering the local Salvation Army; motion approved.

Pastor's evaluation – Dean Fries prepared a few questions for Pastor's evaluation. Council excused Pastor Carl after and discussed salary. Motion by Bubba Vance, second by Susan Coccie to give Pastor Carl Fiskness a base salary raise of 5% minimum; motion approved. We need to look at his original package and look at the guidelines from LCMC. Effective January 2014.

Next meeting – Tuesday, December 17th, 2013 at 7:15 PM.

Pastor Carl closed with prayer. Meeting adjourned.
