reetings brothers and sisters in Christ,

We are entering February this month in which we will finish the season of Epiphany. This is the season where, each week, we are given a new revelation about who Jesus is and what His ministry will teach us. In January, we learned Jesus is the Son of God and was anointed with the Holy Spirit at His Baptism. We saw His first miracle at the wedding in Cana and learned how it was pointing to the mission He would accomplish during His time on earth.

Last week we saw how, in Nazareth, He presented himself as the Messiah, and they wanted to kill Him. In the first Sunday of February, we see how Jesus teaches with authority and does many miracles and casts out demons. People are awed by this, but only the demons knew He was the Holy One of God. The second week we will see that Jesus calls His first disciples and reveals that they will become fishers of men.
